St. Andrew's Church Services at Christmas


St. Andrew's Church, Leasingham, will be holding the following services in the lead up to Christmas, which you are very welcome to attend:

Building Work Update




Over the course of this week, the builders have been working on:

Pick the device

Basic phones can message and make calls but children will not be able to access apps

Helmet - Parental Controls

2 Before giving your child any device make sure you access parental controls and discuss apps you are happy for them to access

Brakes - Stop and Think

- Teach children to stop and think before they reshare information or reply to comments,
- Protection Block and report

 Teach your children how to block and report on the games and apps they are using.

Stabilizers - Tech free areas

Keep technology out of bedrooms and charge devices downstairs
