Building Work Update

Our classroom/resource extension is moving closer and closer to completion. We hope to be able to share further news of this after half term. This week, the builders have been working on:

- 1.Beginning the plaster boarding of masonry walls and applying stud partitions to the toilets.
- 2.Mechanical, electrical and plumbing installation
- 3.Demolition of previous partition across the corridor and the double doors to the cloakroom.
- 4.Installation of rainwater goods to the roof fascia
- 5.Completion of the soffit at the roof eaves.
- 6.Installation of the flood barriers
