# York Update (Reception)



York Class started the term by exploring the celebrations of Diwali and Bonfire Night. We created our own beautiful 'Rangoli Patterns' by using our printing skills and added sequins as a finishing touch to make them sparkle! We had lots of fun using salt and PVA glue to create firework shapes on black card. When we decorated them with the watercolour paints, we were amazed to see the colours 'pop'. It was like our very own firework display.

Next, we moved onto some traditional stories as we began our topic of 'Once Upon a Time...' Our first story was all about 'The Gingerbread Man' and there was an opportunity to bake gingerbread people of our own. We were very relieved that none of them escaped from the oven while we were cooking them! Our next story was all about 'Goldilocks' and we made our own porridge. It was not too hot or too cold. We managed to cook it so that it was 'just right'. We talked about what the characters might have been saying throughout the story and had a go at writing our own speech bubbles for them.

Soon we will be thinking about the story of 'The Three Little Pigs' and building them some houses to live in that the wolf cannot blow down. The adults in York are excited to see what we come up with!







# Lincoln Update (Year 1)



The children in Lincoln Class have settled fantastically into life in Year 1. We are enjoying a mix of continuous provision and seated learning which will become more formal throughout the year in preparation for Year 2. Our learning this term links to our topic 'Traditional Tales'.

Here's what some of our continuous provision looks like:







Our Art focus this term has been learning about the work of the artist, Wassily Kandinsky. We explored some of his paintings before recreating our own version of his 'Squares with Concentric Circles' painting. First we did the background, adding different coloured squares to a piece of paper. Then we created a spiral print before dipping it in different colours to create our painting. I'm sure you will agree they are amazing









# Winchester Update (Year 2)



It has been a very busy Autumn Term in Year 2 so far, so the children in Winchester wanted to share their Art and Design Technology learning from this term.

In the first half term, our Art lessons focussed on Pablo Picasso and the Cubism style. Cubism was invented in 1907 and the artist tried to show different views of the same object or person all together in one painting. Picasso used colours and brush strokes to give texture to his figures which he broke down into geometric shapes. He built paintings in layers and used colour to fragment the shapes of objects. Here are some examples of our self-portraits in the Cubist style.





We then moved onto making a self-portrait from clay in the cubist style. We used techniques such as rolling, cutting, moulding and carving to create our clay faces.





Our Design Technology project uses the knowledge we have learnt in our science lessons and is based on the story 'The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark.' We have made Plop the Owl using card, with split pins as levers so that the wings move. Here are some examples of our card prototypes

for you.
